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DIRECTORS' REPORT

Dear Members Assalam o-alaikum,

On behalf of the Board of Directors, it is my privilege to present to you the un-audited Condensed Interim Financial statement of the Company for the six months ended on March 31st, 2021 together with the auditors review report thereon;

Industry Overview

The exorbitant high procurement cost of Sugarcane, reduction in sugar recovery by 0.4% compared to last year, although the country witnessed better Sugarcane production than the last year, whereby the government is insisting the millers to sell sugar below the cost of production of sugar to provide relief to the masses at the expense of millers and ongoing sugar inquiry will ultimately have a negative impact to the sustainability of the industry.

Crushing was commenced on 29th November 2020 and mills operated 87 days as compared to 95 days in the corresponding season. Despite the fact, all-time high Sugar Cane prices and reduced number of operating days, crushing increased by 9% compared to last season recorded at 392,757 M.Tons during the current season (Season 2019-20; 359,528 M.Tons). Similarly, production of sugar also increased by 5% reaching 39,645 M. Tons in the current season (Season 2019-20; 37,614 M.Tons).

The sugar recovery has declined to 10.10% from 10.46% in the last season. The decline is in line with the industry trend.

The net sales achieved at Rs. 653.964 million compared to Rs. 596.52 million in the previous period. The gross profit was remained low achieved at 5.68% due to the high cost of sugarcane and low volume of sales by which the company suffered a loss of Rs. 69.56 million (per share 6.67) compared to Rs. 60.17 million in the corresponding period with loss per share at Rs. 5.77. These financial statements should not be conceived as a reflection of the true state of the company's financial results. Since fixed cost incurred during the period is not absorbed due to low volume of sales. As the sales volume increases the loss either will be wiped off or reduced significantly.

Future Outlook:

The Sugar industry, as a whole, is subject to discriminatory scrutiny from various Government Authorities, in wake of The Sugar Inquiry Commission Report affecting business performance. The Outlook of the sugar industry depends solely on government policies for the creation of enabling business environment for Millers.

Soaring Sugar cane prices calls for government policies to regulate sugar cane prices in consultation with all stakeholders. The collaboration of the Government, the industry and growers are vital for the production of better yielding crops to equilibrate market forces of sugar. Besides, current market dynamics demand a review of the Sales tax mechanism, intending to provide relief for the masses.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REVIEW REPORT

To The Members of Sindh Abadgar's Sugar Mills Limited Report on review of Interim Financial Statements

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying condensed interim statement of financial position of **Sindh Abadgar's Sugar Mills Limited** ("the Company") as at March 31, 2021 and the related condensed interim statement of profit or loss, condensed interim statement of comprehensive income, condensed interim statement of changes in equity, and condensed interim statement of cash flows and notes to the financial statements for the six months period then ended (here-in-after referred to as the "interim financial statements"). Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of these interim financial statements in accordance with accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the interim financial statements based on our review.

Scope of review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements 2410, 'Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity.' A review of interim financial statements consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and, consequently, does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

As part of our engagement, we were only required to review the cumulative figures for the six-month period ended March 31, 2021. Accordingly, we have not reviewed the figures in the condensed interim statement of profit or loss and the condensed interim statement of comprehensive income for the three-month period ended March 31, 2021.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim financial statements are not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting.

NOTES TO THE CONDENSED INTERIM FINANCIAL INFORMATION

FOR THE HALF YEAR AND QUARTER ENDED MARCH 31, 2021 (UN-AUDITED)

1. STATUS AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

Sindh Abadgar's Sugar Mills Limited ("the Company") is a public listed company incorporated in Pakistan under the repealed Companies Ordinance, 1984 which has now been replaced by Companies Act, 2017 ('the Act'). The shares of the Company are quoted on Pakistan Stock Exchange Limited. The principal business of the Company is the production and sale of white crystalline sugar.

The geographical location and address of Company's business units, including plant are as under:

Head office: The Company's registered office is situated at 209, Progressive Plaza, Beaumont Road, Karachi, Pakistan.

Mill: The Company's plant is located at Deh Deenpur, District Tando Muhammad Khan, Sindh, Pakistan.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

2.1 Statement of compliance

These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting. The accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan comprise of:

- International Accounting Standard (IAS) 34 'Interim Financial Reporting' issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) as notified under the Companies Act, 2017; and
- Provisions of, and directives issued under, the Companies Act, 2017.

Where the provisions of, and directives issued under, the Companies Act, 2017 differ with the requirements of IAS 34, the former have been followed.

These condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information and disclosures required in the audited financial statements, and should be read in conjunction with Company's annual audited financial statements as at and for the year ended September 30, 2020.



2.2 Basis of measurement of items in these condensed interim financial statements

These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except for land, buildings and plant & machinery which are carried under the revaluation model of accounting for property, plant and equipment.

2.3 Functional and presentation currency

Items included in these condensed interim financial statements are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates. These condensed interim financial statements are presented in Pak Rupees which is also the Company's functional and presentation currency.

2.4 Judgements and sources of estimation uncertainty

In preparing these condensed interim financial statements, the significant judgments made by management in applying the Company's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those applied in the annual financial statements of the Company as at and for the year ended September 30, 2020.

2.5 Significant accounting policies

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements are consistent with those applied in the preparation of the annual audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended September 30, 2020.

- 6.1 This represents the amount availed under a short term cash finance facility obtained from M/s. Bank Al-Falah Limited to meet working capital requirements. The limit of liability is Rs. 500 million (September 30, 2020: Rs. 500 million). The facility carries markup at the rate of 1 month kibor + 1% (September 30, 2020: 1 month kibor +1% per annum) and is secured by pledge over fresh stocks of sugar amounting to Rs. 555.555 million with 10% margin under effective control of bank's approved mucaddam.
- 6.2 This represents the amount availed under a short term running finance facility obtained from M/s.Bank Al-Falah Limited to meet working capital requirements. The limit of liability is Rs. 200 million (September 30, 2020: Rs. 200 million). The facility carries markup at the rate of 1 month kibor + 1% (September 30, 2020: 1 month kibor +1% per annum) and is secured by 1st Joint pari passu hypothecation charge over stocks of sugar (unpledged) and receivables of the company for Rs. 266.667 million registered with SECP, with 25% margin.

7. CONTINGENCIES AND COMMITMENTS

There is no change in the status of the contingencies and commitments set out in the note 13 to the Company's annual financial statements for the year ended September 30, 2020, except for note 13.6 which has been presented below:

"During the current period, the A/DCIR(Audit-I) Inland Revenue also passed order U/s. 122(1) against notices issued U/s. 177(1) of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001 resulting in income tax demand of Rs. 3.6 billion for the tax year 2016 and Rs. 4.9 billion for the tax year 2017 and the CIR(Appeals-I) upheld the said impugned orders as well.

The Company, therefor, filed appeals against the orders of CIR(A) with the Income Tax Appellate Tribunal challenging impugned orders for the four tax years from 2016 to 2019. The Appellate Tribunal stayed the demand vide its order dated 27-05-2021, copy of which is expected to be issued in the next few days. The Company has, therefore, not made any provision against the subject tax demands since in the opinion of its tax and legal advisor, all the above assessments have been framed on frivolous and flimsy grounds without applying judicial mind and without following due process of law (refer note 13.6 to the financial statements for the year ended September 30, 2020).

On a periodic basis, the Company engages an independent external valuer to carry out a fresh revaluation of these operating fixed assets to ensure that their carrying amounts in the financial statements do not differ materially from that which would be determined using fair value at the end of the reporting period. Such valuation usually involves the use of observable and unobservable inputs; however, the weightage of observable inputs used is considered as significant. Accordingly, the Company classifies the aforesaid classes of operating fixed assets within Level 2 of the fair value hierarchy.



The management considers that the fair value of all other assets and liabilities recognised in the financial statements approximate their fair value.

15. OPERATING SEGMENT

These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared on the basis of single reportable segment. The category-wise disclosures required by the accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan are as follows:

- Revenue from sale of sugar represents 60.57% (September 30, 2020: 88.27%) of the total revenue whereas remaining represent revenue from sale of molasses and bagasse.
- Nil (September 30, 2020: 2.5%) revenue of the Company relates to customers outside Pakistan.
- All non-current assets of the Company at March 31, 2021 and September 30, 2020 were located in Pakistan.

16. GENERAL

16.1. Impact of Covid-19 on these condensed interim financial statements

As in the rest of the world, Covid-19 adversely affected lifestyle and business operations in Pakistan. The Company complies with SOPs prescribed by the Federal and Provincial Governments. Sales activities were not affected during lockdown, and the shipments were dispatched as per schedule with minor disruptions. The Company remained up to date in all its financial commitments. Management believes that going concern assumption of the Company remains valid, and there are no material implications that require specific disclosure in these condensed financial statements.



16.2. Subsequent event

The Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan ("the Commission") vide letter EMD/233/364/2002-283 ("the impugned letter") dated April 09, 2021 has initiated examination and evaluation of the financial statements of the Company for the year ended September 30, 2020. Subsequently, on May 18, 2021, the Company file suit 1143 / 2021 in the Honourable High Court of Sind ("the Court") and sought declaration to the effect that issuance of the letter is illegal, unlawful and void ab initio and is liable to be quashed. The Court declared the operation of impugned letter as suspended and restrained the Commission to take any adverse / coercive action against the Company till the next hearing which is scheduled on May 24, 2021.

16.3. Date of authorization for issue of these condensed interim financial statements

These condensed interim financial statements were authorized for issue by the Board of Directors of the Company in their meeting held on 27th May, 2021.

16.4. Level of rounding

Unless otherwise indicated, all figures in these condensed interim financial statements have been rounded off to the nearest rupee.
